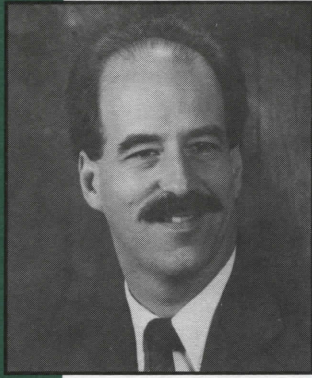

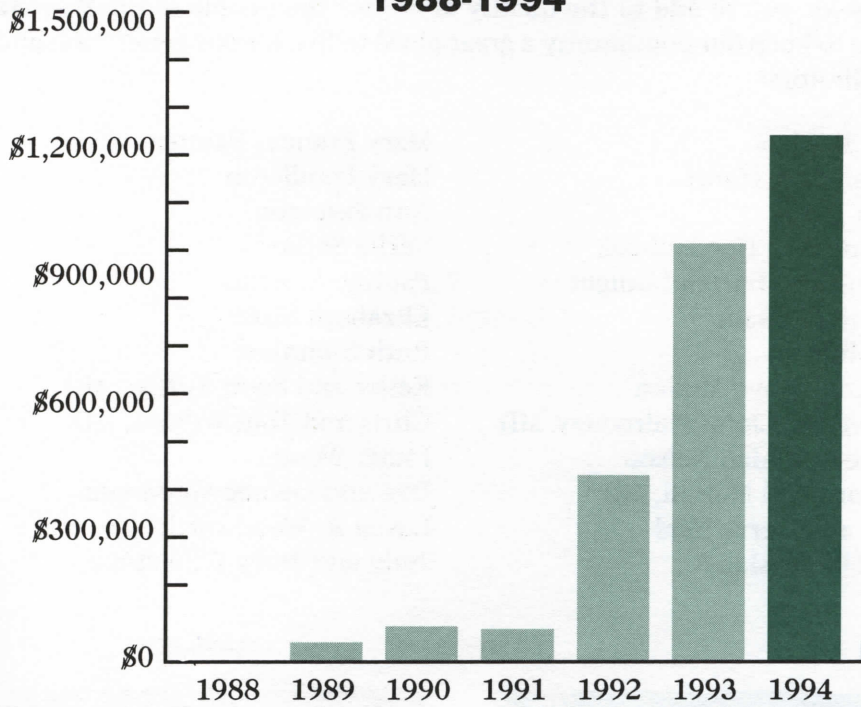

RESTRICTED FUND 1988-1994

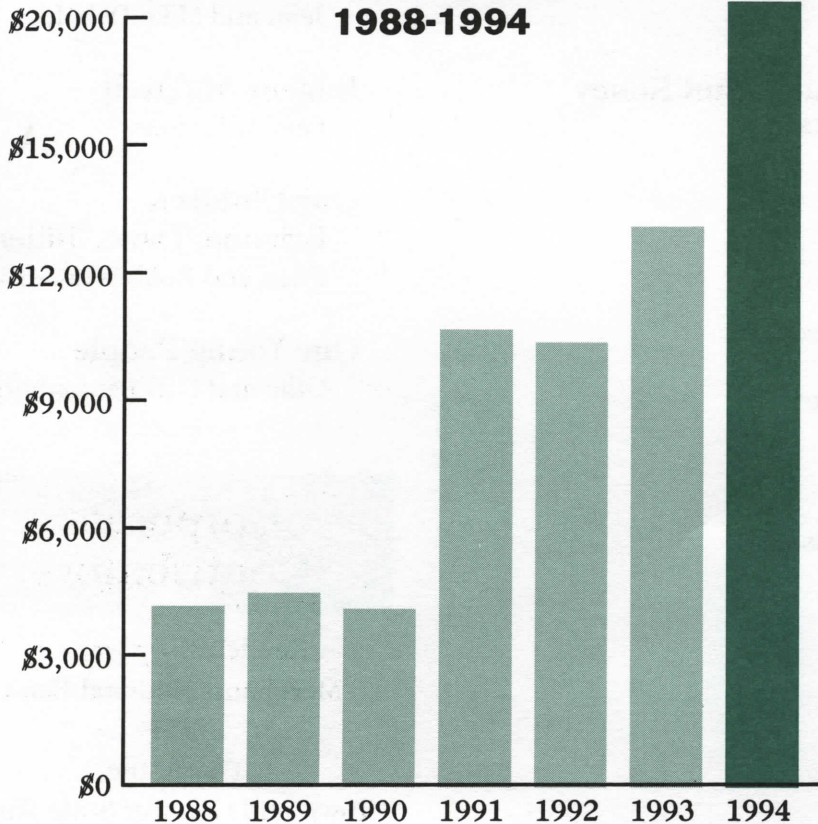
