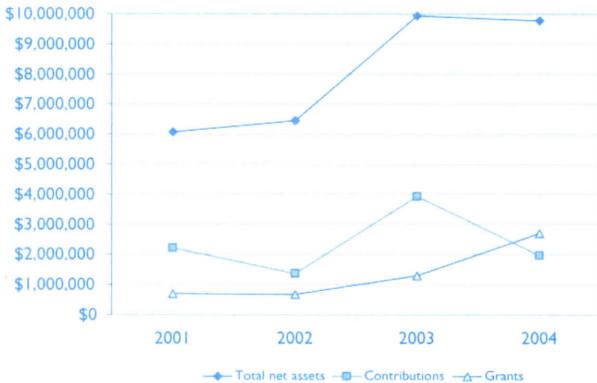

Donors may require that the principal remain intact in perpetuity, for a defined period of time, or until sufficient assets have been accumulated to achieve a designated purpose.

A **PASS-THROUGH FUND** is one in which the fund advisor may grant out of the principal.

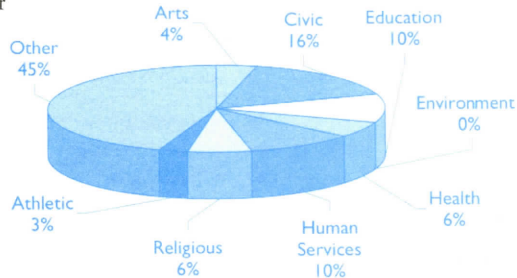

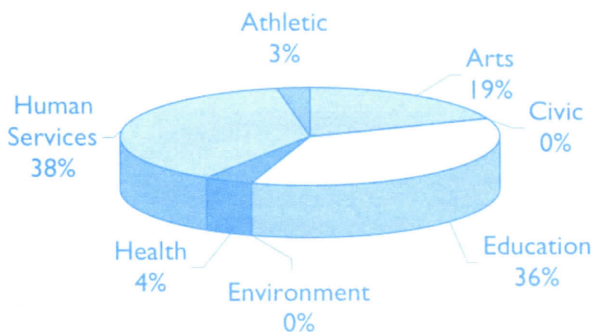

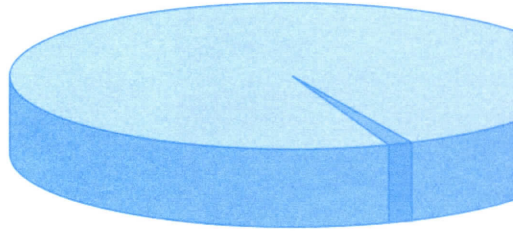

The Winona Fund was initiated in 2004 to allow the staff and board of directors at the Winona Community Foundation to respond to current community needs with a modest grant from the general fund. 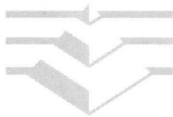
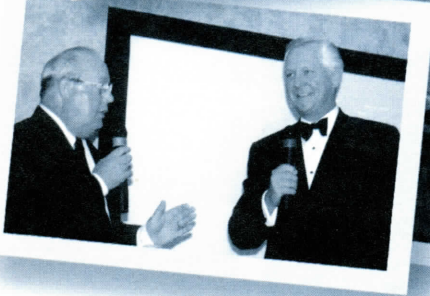
