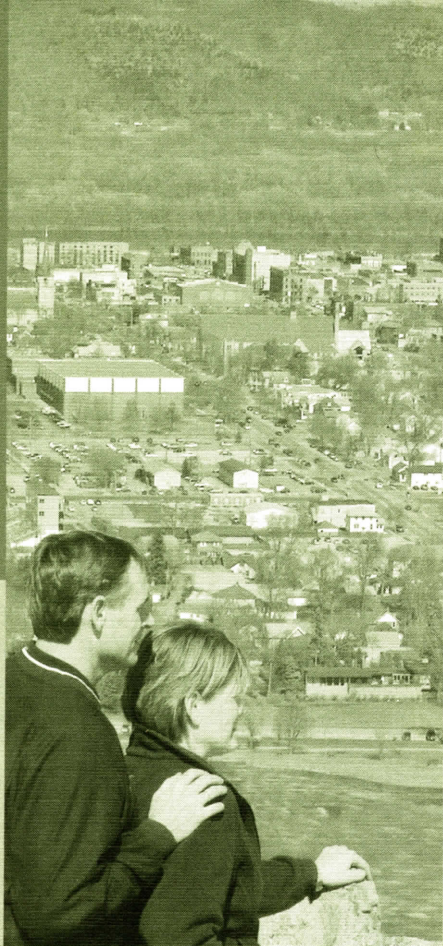

The Winona Community Foundation improves the quality of life in the Winona area by:

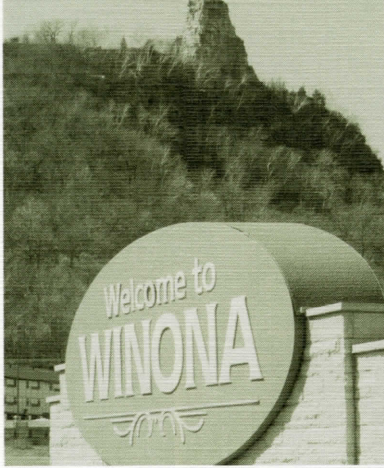

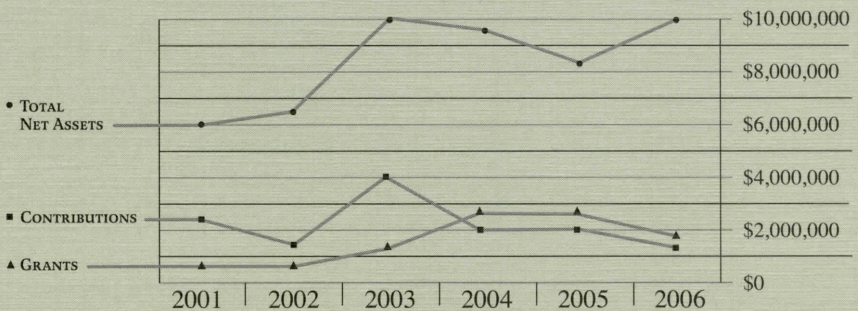

An ENDOWED FUND is one in which the principal is kept intact and only a certain amount of the earnings are available each year for granting purposes. Donors may require that the principal remain intact in perpetuity, for a defined period of time, or until sufficient assets have been accumulated to achieve a designated purpose.

A PASS-THROUGH FUND is one in which the fund advisor may grant out of the principal.

In 2006, the BK 5K Youth Fund was established with the Winona Community Foundation. The partnership allowed the organizers the opportunity to create a fund using the Winona Community Foundation's charitable status to meet a goal of supporting community youth projects from the race proceeds.

The Fund and race are to honor Fastenal founder and long-time runner Bob Kierlin, as well as to support Winona and Goodview youth programs. A competitive grant process for funding youth groups has been established to allocate proceeds from the race. Almost \$23,000 was dispersed to Winona and Goodview area youth programs in 2006.

Winona Area Big Brothers Big Sisters, contributed to the race event and was awarded funding to support their successful youth mentoring programs. Winona Senior High School and Cotter High School also provided numerous student and adult volunteers during the event as well as received funding to support athletics and fine arts.

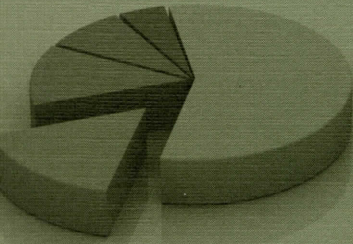

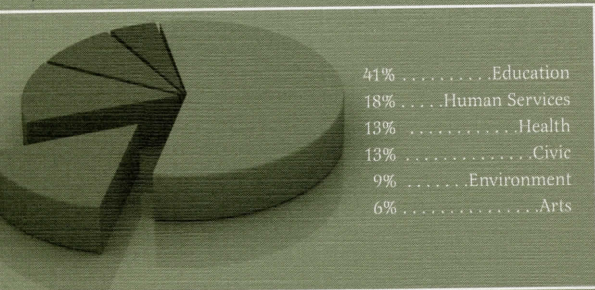

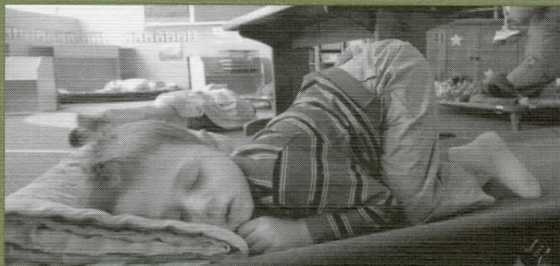

provided the opportunity for an interactive environmental experience.

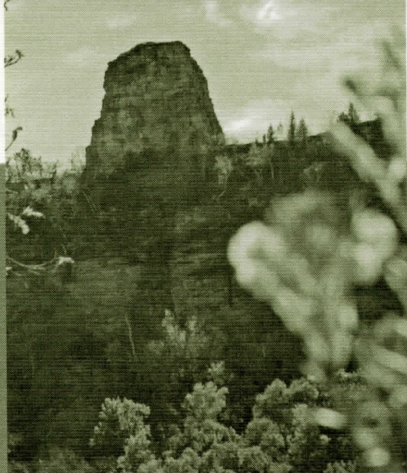
It is a compilation of four distinct, interactive gardens that allow students to observe, change and discover the wonders of their environment.
