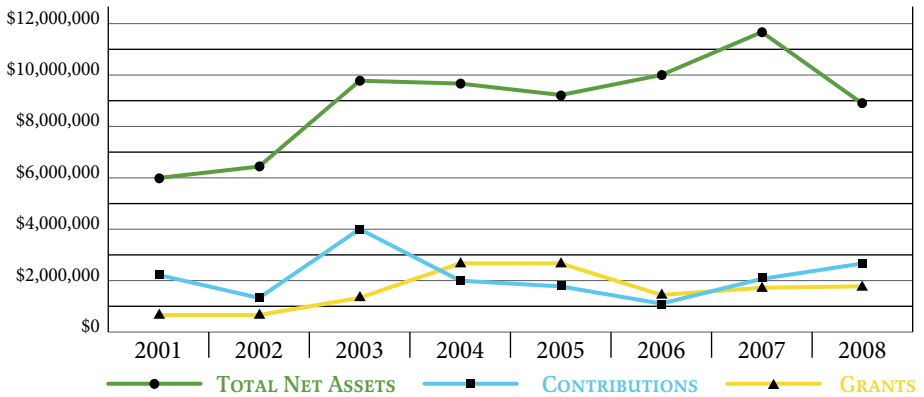

NEW IN 2008 “DON'T LET YOUR ORGANIZATION DISAPPEAR”

There are over 542,000 U.S. nonprofits who are not required to file IRS Form 990 or 990-EZ because their annual gross receipts are under \$215,000. However, they are now required to electronically submit Form 990-N (e-Postcard). The first filing was required by May 15, 2008. Minnesota has 17,659 previous non-filers that should now file the 990-N, but as of May 15 only 1,714 have done so.

Organizations that fail to submit their information for three years in a row will have their tax-exempt status revoked by the IRS. Links to file the 990-N can be found at www.irs.gov/charities.

If you are involved in a small nonprofit, please remind them to file and pass the word along to others.

WISE GIVING THROUGH THE EYES OF CHILDREN

Giving is considered a desire to help others. As the Winona Community Foundation continues to strive to connect needs with inspired givers, the question has arisen at Board meetings, what inspires each of us to give and how do we teach this to others.

In an effort to promote and teach wise giving, WCF created its Youth in Philanthropy (YiP) program in 2003.
